OUR MISSION

KSEF's mission is to provide support to **2 talented children, every year**, from local families where the fees would otherwise be an insuperable barrier to entry. Pupils will typically enter KS in Year 7 and continue in Year 8. Former KS bursary pupils are also supported through their journey at their secondary schools if required. KSEF students have been immensely successful at gaining bursaries and scholarships to secondary schools, including St. Paul's, Uppingham and Kings College School, Wimbledon. Nevertheless, with the expansion of KS to Year 11, KSEF pupils now have two choices. Either they can leave KS at the end of Year 8 (the current practice) or they can be re-assessed in Year 8 to be considered for a place at KS in Year 9 until Year 11



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ENRICHING OUR COMMUNITY

Since 2008, KSEF has been able to provide means tested bursaries for **13 bright and able children**. These pupils invariably make a significant contribution to life at KS enriching the experience for both pupils and teachers. They enhance the diversity in our school community and thereby reflect more fully the wider world in which our children will eventually live and work.


FUNDRAISING

Since inception, KSEF has raised a little over £1,200,000 and we continue to be extremely cost conscious, with expenses remaining below 10% of the value of donations. KSEF funds come from:
